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THE FIRST EVER POLL OF THE 2012 IOWA REPUBLICAN PRESIDENTIAL CAUCUS VOTE COMMISSIONED BY RIGHTOSPHERE.COM SHOWS THE RACE TO BE WIDE OPEN; MIKE HUCKABEE ENJOYS SLIGHT EDGE AT THIS EARLY STAGE; SARAH PALIN TRAILS MITT ROMNEY IN HEAD-TO-HEAD MATCHUP, BUT HAS ROOM TO GROW; NUMBER OF UNDECIDED VOTERS CHANGE DRAMATICALLY DEPENDING UPON WHO ENTERS THE RACE.

The first ever poll of the 2012 Iowa Republican Presidential caucus vote, commissioned by Rightosphere.com and conducted by Right Way Marketing, shows the race to be wide open at this early stage.

The poll found 2008 Iowa Caucus winner Mike Huckabee leading the field with 17% of the vote; followed by former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney at 14%, former Alaskan Governor Sarah Palin at 11%, current Minnesota Governor Tim Pawlenty at 1%, former New Mexico Governor Gary Johnson with less than 1% support, and 57% undecided at this time.

When respondents were asked whom they would support should Gov. Mike Huckabee choose to forgo a presidential run, Gov. Mitt Romney lead Gov. Sarah Palin 28% to 20%, with Minnesota Gov. Tim Pawlenty enjoying 4% support, Gov. Gary Johnson 1%, and 47% of the respondents were undecided. Gov. Romney's eight percentage point lead over Gov. Palin is outside of the poll's 5.66% margin of error.

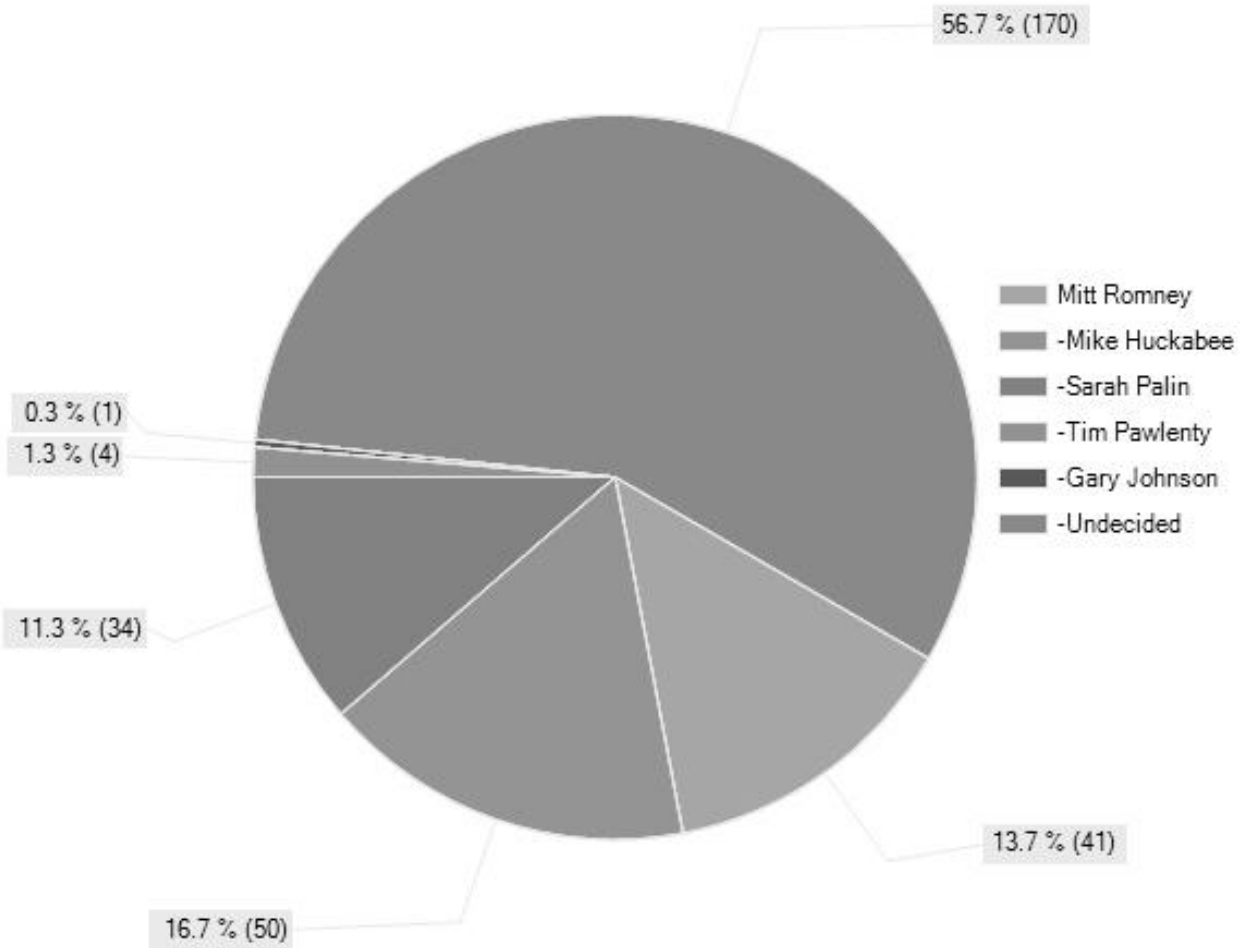
When respondents were asked whom they would support should Gov. Sarah Palin choose to forgo a presidential run, Gov. Huckabee lead Gov. Romney by a single percentage point, 29% to 28%, with Gov. Pawlenty at 2%, Gov. Johnson at 1%, and 40% undecided.

Gov. Palin's inclusion in the field lead to a higher percentage of undecideds on both questions polled, suggesting that Iowa Republican voters are taking a "wait-and-see" approach to her potential presidential candidacy.

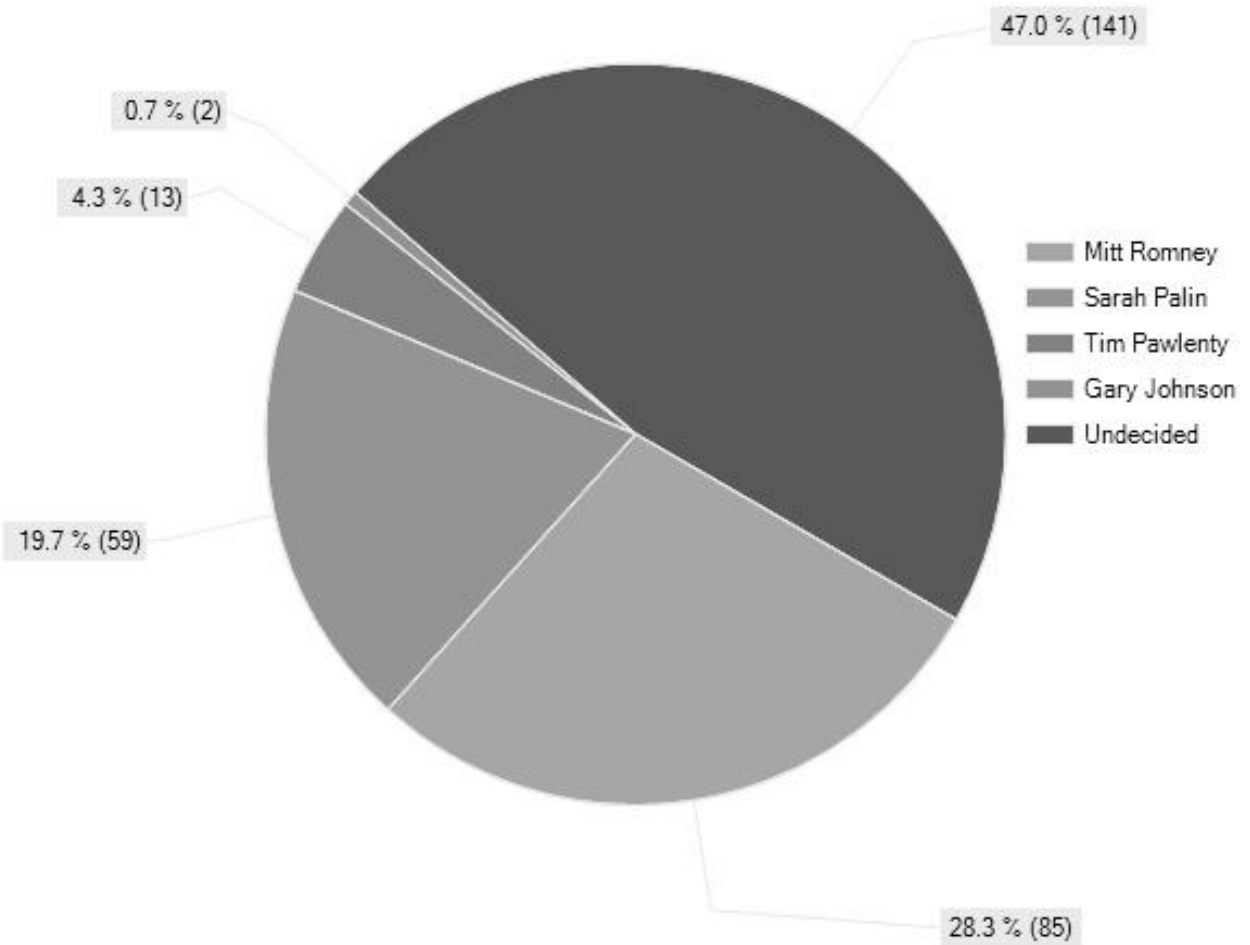
The poll results were collected via telephone surveys of 300 registered Republican voters on March 4th, 2010. The sample includes a subset of 223 likely 2012 Republican Caucus attendees. The margin of

sampling error is +/- 5.66% percentage points. The poll was conducted on behalf of Rightsphere.com by Right Way Marketing of Nashville, TN. Full crosstabs will be released later in the week.

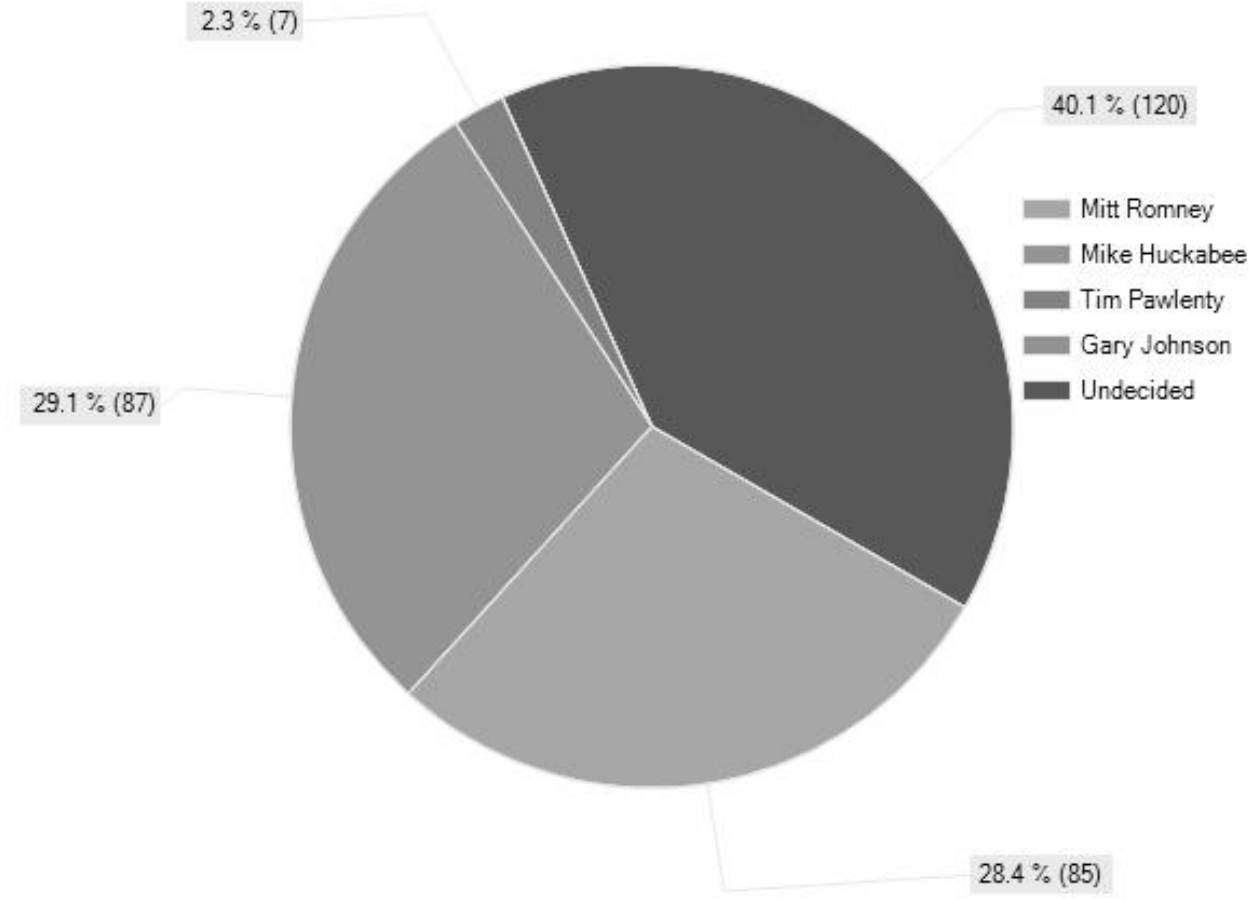
If you had to vote today, for whom would you cast your ballot for at your caucus for the 2012 Republican Presidential nomination?
